*women includes cis, trans and intersex women, as well as non-binary and gender non-conforming people who identify in a significant way as women, femme or female.

Project description:	An opportunity to apply to Stellar Quines to participate in a short series of workshops delivered by industry professionals from the field of Production Management. Participants will develop an understanding of professional processes, potential career paths while building practical skills and increased confidence.

What it is

Our M*****class series directly responds to the gender imbalance due to the lack of women working in creative design and production roles within the performing arts sector of Scotland.

Across Scottish publicly funded theatres in 2014/15 Christine Hamilton's report Where are the Women? identified that:

- 6% of lighting designers were women
- Women made up 11% of composers, musical directors and sound designers

Over this three-year period, Stellar Quines are offering a unique training opportunity for women who have some experience or interest in the field on offer, but require refreshment or up-skilling before presenting themselves as a viable candidate for these positions.



These workshops have been designed and will be lead by Fi Fraser, one of Scotland's leading Production Managers. Find out more about Fi here

The workshops will aim to demonstrate and combine the techniques and Processes from 1st meeting with Director/Producer to Press night; Relationships with creatives, technical team, venues, and suppliers; Schedules; Budgets; and Touring including international touring.

In providing an opportunity for early stage or mid-career level production managers, we will:

- Provide participants with a high-profile opportunity to explore a new area of interest, acquire new skills, increase confidence, make new contacts and forge new career paths
- Offer Stellar Quines and the wider sector a new tranche of highly skilled, well connected production managers.
- Supporting participants through networks leading to a professional working portfolio
- Plug a gap in opportunities for practitioners to go on a continuous learning journey by up-skilling or working across art forms in a supported, controlled and professional environment

The programme of work

 Initial Meetings (first meetings with team, employment and building team, legal including risk assessments and regulations, fit up)
- Wednesday 25th November, 10am -1.30pm [on Zoom]
 Relationships (your team, Designers, Producer, Director, Venues, Suppliers; schedules, contracts, first fit up and technical/ production week)
- Friday 27th November, 10am -1.30pm [on Zoom]
 Budget and Money (Budget management, reporting)
 Touring including International Touring (Venue information, transport management, riders, freight)

Placements:

Due to current government restrictions surrounding the Covid-19 pandemic, the practical element of M****classes is unable to take place. As an alternative offer, we are offering **2x Paid Production Manager placements** (fee is £1,000) that will take place after the workshops and when Covid 19 restrictions are lifted and allow for a return to a safer working environment. These are shadowing opportunities which will take place once COVID restrictions allow. Placement opportunities will only be open to M*****classes: PM graduates and details of how to apply for these placements will communicated after the online training is complete..

We encourage you to

- use this as an opportunity to challenge yourself, to develop the work you've already done and expand on, try out new, or compliment your current skill set
- apply even if you have a lot of experience in production management (i.e commercial events) or technical applications but are new to theatre making, and are looking for an opportunity to develop your skills and apply these to a performance setting
- if the technical aspects of production management put you off taking the next steps into the profession, this is exactly the series for you. Use this to embrace learning in safe and supported environment.
- · forge new relationships, expand your contacts and learn new skills



We are open to applications from individual practitioners who identify as a woman. We support all women including Trans and Intersex women, as well as non—binary and gender fluid people who identify in a significant way as women or female.

We encourage applications from practitioners who identify as D/deaf and disabled.

We encourage applications from people from all backgrounds including those who identify as being from the African diaspora, Latinx, the East Asian diapora, from the South East Asian Diaspora, from the South Asian Diaspora, West Asian Diaspora (includes Middle East), Indigenous people, bi-racial/ mixed heritage, or who also self-identify as a Person of Colour or Black, we may use BIPOC+ to refer to people from these identities.

FAQs

Will it cost me anything to participate?



No. Full cost of the project is covered by us. We also offer a contribution towards travel, access including child care costs if necessary.

Will this be an opportunity to secure a job with Stellar Quines?

Not necessarily, but we do hope that this will create a pool of brilliant Production Managers working in the sector, drawn upon by many organisations, including us.

Do I have to be based in and/or committed to working in Scotland? Yes.

I can't attend all of the dates, should I still apply?

No. Sorry. In order to fully benefit from this learning experience, we expect participants to attend all sessions.

Why is it called M*****classes?

We recognise the traditions and patriarchal structures that define the language we use on a day to day basis. After careful consideration, we concede that 'masterclasses' defined the offer we were making in the best terms, but because we conceded, doesn't mean we gave up the fight! As a project aimed specifically at women, we wanted to retain their importance at the heart of the project, and have treated the word in all our publicity to reflect that.

I am a Technical Manager with little Production Manager experience, can I apply?

Yes! This could be the beginning of the path to you developing that as a string to your professional bow.

Do I need any kit?

Ideally you'd have a laptop to work off. The programme will look at software including excel and Vectorworks (shown in powerpoint presentation). Please contact us if there are any barriers and how we can support your participation.

I have worked as a CSM and have supported production managers before but with no formal training, can I apply?

Yes! So long as you are open to learning and developing your craft alongside a group who will retain different skill sets and experiences to yours. This programme is open to those who work in different roles production and technical roles (including SM, DSM, ASM, CSM, FOH) who have had some experience and want to develop as a production manager
